9 - 12 p.m. Walking Tour

Spanish, Minorcan, African American and Civil Rights-era places tell the story of the people who inhabited St. Augustine through time. Includes visit inside two buildings.

Meet in the Plaza at the 1812 Constitution Obelisk. Please dress comfortably for this walking tour, which should be about a mile.


